So Where is the Application Form?

As announced in the last newsletter, we are departing from the long tradition of pre-printed application forms being included with this newsletter. This year you will have 3 options of how to submit your Performer, Workshop, Dance Band, Caller and/or Volunteer application forms.

1) You may apply directly from our website by filling out an **online form**. For most folks this is the fastest and most simple.

2) You may **download** an application form as a PDF file from our website, print it out, fill it in, and mail it back to us.

3) You may contact us by mail, phone or email and request that we **mail you a paper application** form. You will then need to mail your completed form back to us.

In all cases the **deadline of March 1 is firm** for performer applications. Workshop and Dance Band applications might be accepted past the deadline depending on availability. Volunteer applications will be accepted anytime, but earlier is better. It is also still the case that we cannot accept faxes or email applications.

When using a web form to apply, your submitted information will be immediately entered into our database and a confirmation email message will be sent back to you with a PDF copy of your completed form. This is for your own records only. You cannot make changes after you submit a form, so prepare your entries carefully ahead of time.

Every year some disappointed musician discovers that they waited too long to apply. Don't let this be you. **The DEADLINE is March 1, 2013 at 5pm** - in our hands, not just postmarked.

Cahalen & Eli

Pulling from bluegrass, old-time, and country traditions this duo is gaining acclaim for their phenomenal harmonies, original song-writing, and clean picking styles. With an amazingly full sound for a duo, as Tim O'Brien writes "the duet of **Cahalen Morrison** and **Eli West** suggests the infinite possibilities in sound, texture, and mood contained in a pair of voices and a couple stringed instruments."

Cahalen Morrison writes songs that sound like a Cormac McCarthy novel: simple, beautifully crafted, and seemingly formed from raw natural elements. Eli West brings jagged, angular arrangements based in bluegrass and old-time, but refracted through a 21st century lens. Together, Cahalen and Eli tap the root of the old country and bluegrass duets. As the sparse landscapes of Cahalen's vocals reflect the warm glow of Eli's voice, it's clear that this duo was made to sing together.

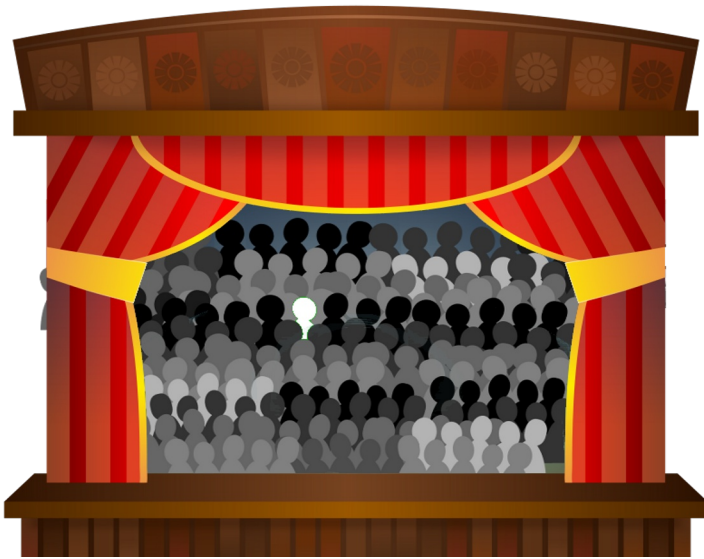

Scheduling Difficulties

In recent years, it has been harder to fit all the would be performers into the limited (aprox 130) number of main stage time slots. In one sense, this is a good problem to have. We are glad that so many of you are interested in keeping the music going by playing at the festival, but last year over 50 acts had to be wait listed. We strive to feature all the different strands of folk music and so will only put so many of one type of performance in a concert lineup. What can be done about this? The number of concerts and their length is maxed out. Setting up a second venue doubles costs but not the donations and volunteers needed. No one involved with AFF has any desire to change our tradition of open access by requiring auditions.

If you are a frequent performer, please consider a main stage set "sabbatical" and just enjoy the many jamming opportunities at the festival. Many of our favorite performers already do this. As an experienced performer maybe you could mentor inexperienced performers. Or ask yourself this: if you you have been asked to play in some other sets, do you really need your own 15 minutes too? If you are a solo act, please consider doubling up with another solo friend who also wants some stage time. And for singer-songwriters, perhaps the Goldtown Nickelodeon (907-586-2875) or the Showcase at the Silverbow could be your venue this year.

Imagine a rush hour traffic jam where each driver is wishing that others would carpool or take the bus so that he or she can have an open road. We have a musical equivalent every spring and are hoping you can help clear the way. If you have other ideas, comments, or solutions regarding scheduling problems, we'd like to see them.
